The opioid and substance misuse epidemic and its negative health outcomes have touched almost every American. Community-level partnerships and tailored strategies are critical for supporting our communities and implementing a successful response to this epidemic.

This **free** one-day, in-person symposium, hosted by the Addiction Alliance of Georgia (AAG) in partnership with the Hazelden Betty Ford Foundation and Emory University, will build upon the considerable strengths and existing clinical knowledge in our community to create competent and comprehensive trauma-informed integrated care for opioid use disorders throughout the state of Georgia.

Integrated care for opioid use disorders is a process that involves collaboration among stakeholders, including patients and their families, medical providers, mental health clinicians, peer professionals, case managers, community supporters and community-based mutual aid support. Symposium participants will have the opportunity to attend practice-specific informational sessions while increasing knowledge of integrated care for opioid use disorders.

Together, we will bring hope, healing and the power of recovery to the people in our communities.
